

**ORDINANCE PROHIBITING LOITERING**

At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Parksley held on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2000, at which time the Mayor and all members of Council were present, the following Ordinance was adopted by the following vote:

AYES: Rick Chase, Mark Rew, Ellen Boyce, Braxton Parks, and Frank Russell

NAYS: James Eichelberger

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia Code 15.2-926, a Town may provide by Ordinance for the prohibition of loitering in, upon or around any public place, whether on public or private property; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Parksley deems such a prohibition of loitering to be reasonable and necessary and in the best interest of the citizens of the Town of Parksley.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Town of Parksley of the County of Accomack, Virginia:

Loitering in, upon or around any public place, whether on public or private property is hereby prohibited within the Town of Parksley.

A violation of the Ordinance shall be punishable as a Class 3 Misdemeanor.
