

ORDINANCE

At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Parksley, Virginia held on the 10th day of September, 2007, at which the Mayor and 4 members of the Council were present, pursuant to authority set forth in the Parksley Town Charter and 15.2-118 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following Amending Ordinance 97-2 was adopted:

BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or entity to set or make any fire, or burn or cause to be burned, any material, natural or man-made, on any street, alley, right-of-way, or other public place at any time except as provided in Paragraph numbered 4 hereof.
2. That it shall be unlawful for any person or entity to set or make any fire, or burn or cause to be burned any material, natural or man-made, on any private property within the corporate limits of the Town of Parksley at any time unless written permission is first obtained from the Town of Parksley at any time unless written permission is first obtained from the Town Zoning Administrator. Any such permitted burning shall be monitored by a Town employee.
3. That it shall be lawful for any person or entity to burn or cause to be burned tree leaves on their private property within the corporate limits of the Town of Parksley between the hours of 9 A.M. and 4:30 P.M. at a site which is located more than Fifty Feet (50ft.) from any occupied building which burning shall be attended at all times by an adult; provided, however, that such burning of the leaves may occur closer than Fifty Feet to any occupants thereof give written permission for same.
4. Any person or entity who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in an amount of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), nor more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each offense.

ORDINANCE

Parksley No. 97-2

At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Parksley, Virginia, held on the 8th day of September, 1997, at which the Mayor and five members of the Council were present, pursuant to authority set forth in the Parksley Town Charter and the provisions of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following Ordinance was adopted:

BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or entity to set or make any fire, or burn or cause to be burned, any material, natural or man-made, on any street, alley, right -of-way, or other public place at any time except as provided in Paragraph numbered 4 hereof.

2. That it shall be unlawful for any person or entity to set or make any fire, or burn or cause to be burned any material, natural or man-made, on any private property within the corporate limits of the Town of Parksley at any time with the exception of tree leaves which may only be burned as provided in paragraph numbered 3 hereof.

3. That it shall be lawful for any person or entity to burn or cause to be burned tree leaves on their private property within the corporate limits of the Town of Parksley between the hours of 9 A.M. and 4:30 P. M. at a site which is located more than Fifty Feet(50 ft.) from any occupied building which burning shall be attended at all times by an adult; provided, however, that such burning of leaves may occur closer then Fifty Feet to any occupied buildings if the occupants thereof give written permission for same.

4. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful to burn leaves, limbs, and any other non-toxic material natural or man-made on property owned by the Town of Parksley if done with the express written permission of the Town of Parksley under the direct supervision and control of an employee of the Town of Parksley.

5. Any person or entity who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine is an amount of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each offense.
