#### AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED that it shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle, conveyance or trailer, or permit it to stand, whether attended or unattended, at any place designated for handicapped persons, except disabled persons or vehicle owners to whom special plates or decals are issued according to law, by signs or signs and markings on curbs or streets, erected or marked at the direction of the Town Sergeant.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any vehicle, conveyance or trailer, found in violation of this ordinance may be towed away at the direction of the Town Sergeant.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and shall pay the costs incurred by the Town for any towing fees.
