


ORDINANCE IMPOSING CURFEW FOR MINORS


At a regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Parksley held on the 11th day of October, 1999, at which the Mayor and all members of Council were present, the following Ordinance was adopted by vote as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PARKSLEY, VIRGINIA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to be upon the streets or in or upon any other public place in the Town, whether or not on private property, including in any vehicle operating or parked thereon, between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., unless accompanied by the parent, guardian or some adult person lawfully in charge of such minor.
2. This Ordinance shall not be so construed as to prohibit a minor from attending places of religious worship or meetings held by or under the auspices of public or private schools, Boy or Girl Scouts or other like organizations, or for the purpose of going to or from work, not accompanied by a parent, guardian or some adult person lawfully in charge of such minor, provided said minor has in his or her possession a written statement signed by the parent, guardian or adult person lawfully in charge of such minor that the minor has permission to be at such place or meeting.
3. It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other person having the custody of a minor to allow such minor to be upon the streets or such other public places in the Town, whether or not on private property, including in any vehicle operating or parked thereon, in violation of this Ordinance.
4. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Class 4 Misdemeanor as defined in the Code of Virginia.
5. This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption by the Town Council of the Town of Parksley, Virginia.
